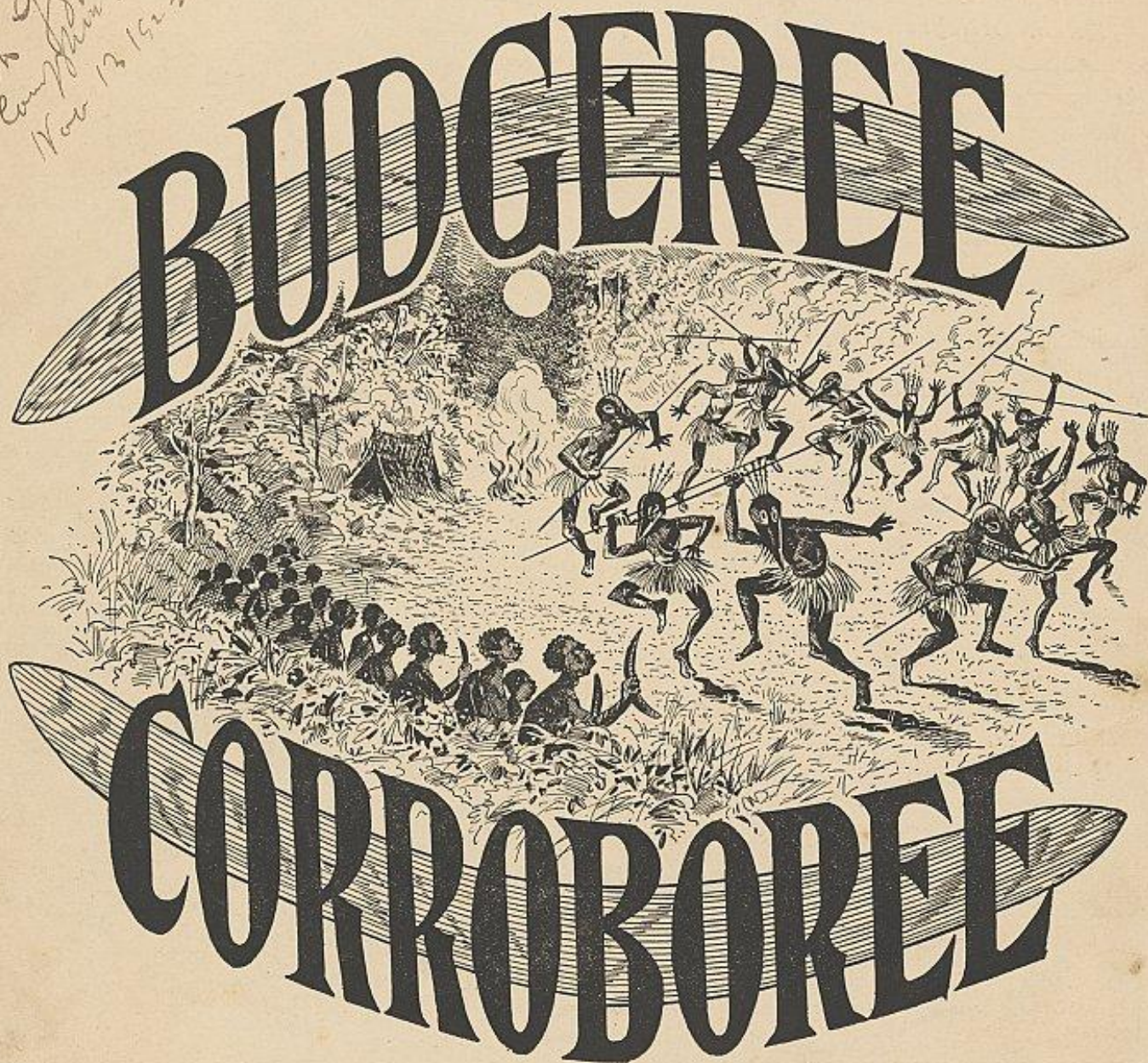

For CHORUS repeat from "Sing."

Shouts may be omitted, but if given must be in proper time as marked. Meaning of shouts:—**Coo-ee**, a call, come here; **Budgerce**, good. **Kookaburra**, laughing jackass; **Bulla Bulla**, good; **Jumbunna**, let's talk; **Boomerang**, to come back, encore.

A Corroboree is a meeting for singing, dancing, and amusement.

The Refrain contains names of places in all States of the Australian Commonwealth, but local names may be substituted for any State, such as "Woolahra, Killara, Bundarra, Ulmarra," (N.S.W.) if desired.
