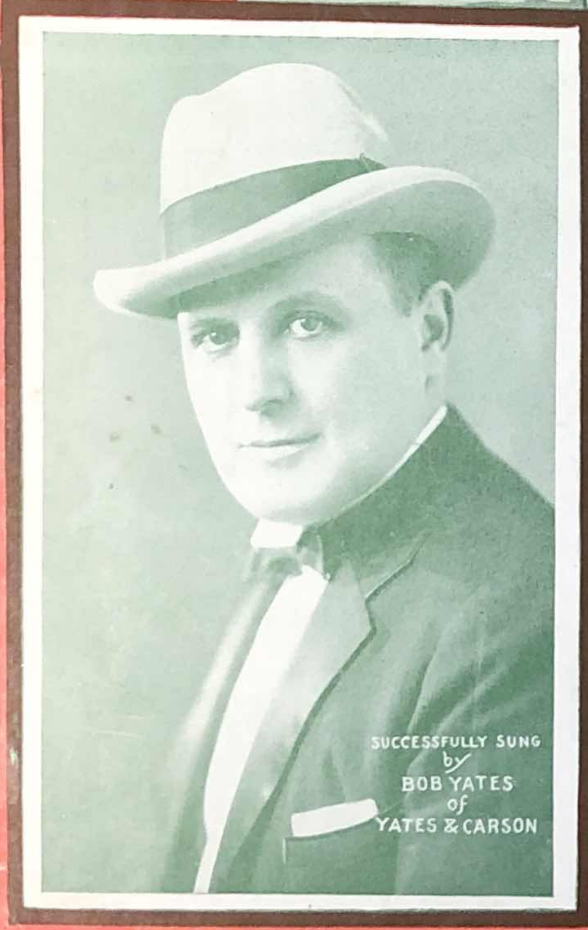

VOICE
